

There is still the imaginative Kascischke of "Space, In Chains" but her lyricism-undeniably poetic, whatever subject she writes about--takes on a darker caste as she floats through hospitals, memories, and a young girl on a bike struck by a car:

[&]quot;and what else can you do

she they've come for you with their sirens and lights and you're young and polite except get into their ambulance and pretend to smile?"

In the "Second Trumpet, she contemplates the silence of God.
